DIVINE LITURGIES AT SAINTS PETER & PAUL

DURING COVID-19 (Updated January 11, 2021)

- **ONLY 30 PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED AT EACH DIVINE LITURGY DUE TO CURRENT PROVINCIAL REGULATIONS.**
- Sunday Liturgies are at the following times: Saturday 5:00 p.m., Sunday 9:00 a.m. (Ukrainian) & Sunday 11:00 a.m.
- Those wishing to attend Divine Liturgy on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings must pre-register with the parish office. Pre-registration is also required for major feast days (like the Annunciation), Presanctified Liturgies on Wednesday and Friday evenings in Lent, and Saturdays for the deceased (Sorokousty). No walk-ins are allowed. To make a reservation, please contact the parish office either by email (sspp@sasktel.net) by Friday at 4:00pm or by phone ([306-343-6516](tel:306-343-6516)) during office hours. No walk-ins are allowed.
- If you have registered for a Sunday Liturgy and find that you will not be able to attend, please let the parish office know so that someone else will be able to attend. Thank you for your consideration and cooperation.
- Liturgies are at 8:00am from Monday to Friday. (In Lent, weekday Liturgies will only be on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday). On major feast days, we have Liturgies at 9:00am and 7:00pm. Saturday morning Divine Liturgy is at 9:00am. On civic holidays, Divine Liturgy is at 9:00am. In Lent, Pre-sanctified Liturgies are at 7:00pm on Wednesday and Friday.
- The church only opens 15 minutes before the start of Liturgy. **Now that we have colder temperatures, an orange pylon is placed outside one of the doors to let everyone know when the door is open.** At a Liturgy without preregistration, please sign in with the usher at the door when you get to church. This is necessary in case contact tracing is required.
- **MASKS - Only children under the age of 2 are NOT required to wear a mask. All other children and all adults are required to wear a mask during the entire service.** Masks will not be provided so it is necessary to bring your own. Please put your mask on in your car or outside. If you are not able to wear a mask then we ask that you do not attend Liturgy.
- Liturgy books are available at the back of the church to borrow and take home or return after.
- Please sit only at the places with a cross made out of tape on the pew backrest. Sit together with members of your own household only.
- Please do not move around the church. Remain at your seat for the entire service except if you have to use the washroom. Please enter and exit the pew from the same aisle (i.e., do not walk across the empty pews).
- Eucharist is given in the hand with a dry host only. Eucharist will be given at the end of Liturgy. Please practice physical distancing in the communion line.
- At the end of Liturgy, please lower the kneeler, because this helps to indicate where sanitization is required after the Liturgy.
- Those who are medically vulnerable and at high risk should consider not attending Divine Liturgy at this time. Liturgies on Sundays and major feast days will continue to be posted on YouTube. The obligation to attend Liturgy on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is still dispensed by Bishop Bryan.

CONFESSIONS

Confessions are held in the church hall and will follow COVID protocols and restrictions.



Saturday 5:00 p.m.– Confessions begin at the start of Liturgy until no one is in line.

Sunday 9:00 a.m. – Confessions begin at the start of Liturgy until no one is in line.

Sunday 11:00 a.m. – Confessions begin after the sermon until no one is in line.

We ask that you line up by the confessionals in the church and one person goes down to the hall. When that person is finished and returns to the church it would be nice to let the next person know that they can go down to the hall.

Please pre-register with the parish office by phone or email for All Souls Saturdays as we are limited to a maximum of 30 people at each service.

E-TRANSFER INFORMATION

Since the beginning of the pandemic, a good number of parishioners have started to make their donations to Saints Peter and Paul via e-transfer. Making e-transfers might work for you too. This method can be used for parish, eparchial, and other collections for which the parish issues tax receipts.

Make a donation to Saints Peter & Paul Parish directly from your bank account using your online banking or your banking app on your smartphone. Make "Saints Peter and Paul Church" the recipient and use the parish email address, sspp@sasktel.net. The parish is set up for autodeposit so no secret questions and answers are required even though you may be asked to set that up. Call or email Theresa in the parish office if you need more information or help.

The Redemptorists are also set up for e-transfers. Use "Ukrainian Catholic Mission" as the recipient and the email address, ucmsaskatoon@gmail.com. The Redemptorists are set up for auto-deposit so no secret questions and answers are required even though you may be asked to set that up. This method can be used for Christmas or Easter gifts to the clergy and bishop as well as Sorokousty offerings. The Redemptorists do NOT accept e-transfers for Liturgy stipends.

COVID-19 Relief Impact on Saints Peter & Paul Budget:

While COVID-19 has presented our parish with many challenges in 2020 and continuing in 2021, we did receive some financial relief from our federal government and the Ukrainian Catholic Foundation of Saskatchewan.

We have also been touched by the sacrifice of those tasked with keeping our parish supported both spiritually and administratively. Father Raymond and Father Michael both volunteered to cut their remuneration in half for three months (Apr-Jun 2020).

Our parish Administrative Assistant, Theresa Gogol, also volunteered to cut her hours for a few months in order to decrease the financial burden on the parish.

In addition, we undertook temporary layoffs for all other personnel until we could determine a course forward and begin to reunite, even in a limited way, once again in our Church.

The sacrifice, and the support of our clergy, staff and parishioners has been a tremendous blessing and has not gone unnoticed. Thank you to all.

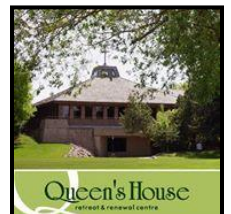

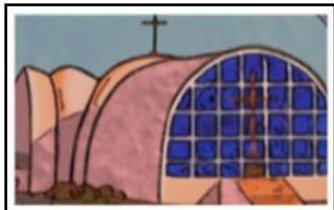
