DIVINE LITURGIES AT SAINTS PETER & PAUL

DURING COVID-19 (Updated June 4, 2021)

(ALL NEW INFORMATION IS IN BOLD TYPE)

- **EFFECTIVE May 30, 2021, THE ATTENDANCE LIMIT AT EACH SERVICE AT SAINTS PETER AND PAUL IS 150 PEOPLE ACCORDING TO NEW PROVINCIAL REGULATIONS.**
- Those wishing to attend Divine Liturgy on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings must pre-register with the parish office. To make a reservation, please contact the parish office either by email (sspp@sasktel.net) by Friday at 4:00pm or by phone (306-343-6516) during office hours. No walk-ins are allowed.
- Sit together with members of your household only. Please sit only at the places with a cross made out of tape on the pew backrest.
- **MASKS** – All children age 2 and older and all adults are required to wear a mask during the entire service even if you are vaccinated. Masks will not be provided so it is necessary to bring your own. Please put your mask on in your car or outside. If you are not able to wear a mask then we ask that you do not attend Liturgy.
- **The church opens 30 minutes before the start of Liturgy.** An orange pylon is placed outside one of the doors to let everyone know when the doors are open.
- At a Liturgy without preregistration, please sign in with the usher at the door when you get to church. This is necessary in case contact tracing is required.
- Divine Liturgy books are available at the back of the church to borrow and take home or return after.
- Please do not move around the church. Remain at your seat for the entire service except if you have to use the washroom. Please enter and exit the pew from the same aisle (i.e., do not walk across the empty pews).
- At the end of Liturgy, please lower the kneeler, because this helps to indicate where sanitization is required after the Liturgy.
- Eucharist is given in the hand with a dry host only. Eucharist will be given at the end of Liturgy. Please practice physical distancing in the communion line.
- Those who are medically vulnerable and at high risk should consider not attending Divine Liturgy at this time. Liturgies on Sundays and major feast days will continue to be posted on YouTube. The obligation to attend Liturgy on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is still dispensed by Bishop Bryan.

LIFTING OF COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS AT SAINTS PETER AND PAUL CHURCH


On Sunday, June 20th, the Saskatchewan Government announced that all public health restrictions, including the mask mandate and gathering size limits, will be lifted on July 11th based on the success of the 3-Step Re-Opening Roadmap.

Therefore, up to and including the Saturday, July 10th 5pm Liturgy, masks, distancing and registration will be required.

Beginning on Sunday, July 11th at the 10am Liturgy, the following will NO LONGER be required at Ss. Peter & Paul:

- Physical distancing
- Mask wearing. (You may continue to wear a mask if it makes you feel safer and/or more comfortable.)
- Registration to attend Liturgy.

COMMUNION – Up to and including Sunday, July 11th, communion will still be distributed as a dry host in the hand. As of Monday, July 12th, communion will begin to be distributed under both species (consecrated bread and wine) **on individual spoons**.



Saint Peter

The Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul is an important day on our church calendar. In fact, it has been re-instated as a feast day of obligation for the Ukrainian Catholic Church. This Feast honours the two apostles who were responsible for laying the foundation for the Church of Christ.

Peter was a simple fisherman who realized the holiness of Jesus the first time he saw Christ. Christ called him the “Rock” (Peter) and said that upon this Rock He would build His Church. Saint Paul, on the other hand, had a different calling and role within the Church. His various letters to the Churches make him the patron of the Local Church.


Saints Peter and Paul are honoured together since they bring together both understandings of the Church. The one brings light to the message of the Gospel and the other makes the light shine more brightly for us by adapting the message to our world-view. The Church unites them in a common celebration on June 29th and gives them identical honour. Since our parish is named for these saints, we celebrate this feast day in a special way to honour our patrons. This is also our parish Praznyk.

For our part, all parishioners should sense the eagerness and joy that the opportunity to celebrate our Praznyk brings. It instills the Spirit of love and joy that our parish family must represent; it encourages us all to a greater generosity of our time and talent to the life of the church. Into our own lives may the celebration bring the fullness of belonging that we need in order to live our Christian lives to the fullest, readily, wholeheartedly and gladly – knowing what the holy Apostles knew, *that God is with us!*

We look forward with great anticipation, after the pandemic ends, when we can all gather to pray and celebrate this Feast Day together with our parish Praznyk.

E-TRANSFER INFORMATION

Since the beginning of the pandemic, a good number of parishioners have started to make their donations to Saints Peter and Paul via e-transfer. Making e-transfers might work for you too. This method can be used for parish, eparchial, and other collections for which the parish issues tax receipts.

Make a donation to Saints Peter & Paul Parish directly from your bank account using your online banking or your banking app on your smartphone. Make “Saints Peter and Paul Church” the recipient and use the parish email address, sspp@sasktel.net. The parish is set up for autodeposit so no secret questions and answers are required even though you may be asked to set that up. Call or email Theresa in the parish office if you need more information or help.

The Redemptorists are also set up for e-transfers. Use “Ukrainian Catholic Mission” as the recipient and the email address, ucmsaskatoon@gmail.com. The Redemptorists are set up for auto-deposit so no secret questions and answers are required even though you may be asked to set that up. This method can be used for Christmas or Easter gifts to the clergy and bishop as well as Sorokousty offerings. The Redemptorists do NOT accept e-transfers for Liturgy stipends.



CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF SASKATCHEWAN



June 24, 2021
Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist

Dear First Nations, Metis, and Inuit communities; Families and Citizens:

With the news this morning of the location of 751 unmarked graves at the former Marieval Indian Residential School at Cowesses First Nation, the Catholic Bishops of Saskatchewan acknowledge that this experience is heartbreakingly devastating for all – and especially residential school survivors, their families and communities. We offer our condolences but we know that this is not enough and our words must move to concrete action.

We are here to listen to you as you communicate those ways we can walk with you in addressing the Calls to Action, rebuilding relations, addressing issues of justice, and working towards a more just society.

The discoveries of gravesites near former residential schools opens deep wounds and brings back terrible memories which re-traumatize. While we cannot imagine how difficult the process must be for survivors, intergenerational survivors and their communities, we honour and support the ongoing investigation of such grave-sites.

In the press conference this morning, Chief Cadmus Delorme stated, “the truth is there,” at the cemetery. We need to hear that truth. We have heard you telling us that healing and reconciliation can only come after the hard work of listening to the truth, a spirit of repentance, concrete acts of justice, and working with you to bring transformation and healing. Chief Delorme went on to say: “Everybody has to reset... Investment in healing from the core outwards has to happen. Once the truth has been given and told and accepted, then reconciliation will prevail.”

We are moved by and strongly support this vision, and commit ourselves to walk in solidarity with you, and to stand by you.

May the Creator guide us as we listen to and receive the truth, that we might together take the necessary steps towards justice, healing, and reconciliation.




