Covenant of Care/Safeguarding 2020 Training Update Who needs to complete safeguarding training?

All persons including clergy, religious, staff or volunteers who work in Eparchial ministries organizations, or affiliated organizations or parishes/parish organizations, who are in positions of trust. The Safeguarding policy p. 8-9 (<https://www.skeparchy.org/wordpress/wp-content/uploads/2020/10/Eparchial-Safeguarding-Policy-Final-Version-06-October-01-2020.pdf>) defines positions of trust as follows:

A 'trust' position will include those:

- *working in an unsupervised setting where ministry, food, transportation or other necessities could be provided to minors and/or vulnerable adults,*
- *having access to confidential information, and/or*
- *being entrusted with control of keys, church property and money.*

Trust positions also include, but are not limited to, Children's or Youth Ministry (including all camps, volunteer driving, Altar Server or Children of Mary Programs, Children's/Youth Choirs, Catechism and Sacramental Prep), and Eucharistic/Pastoral Care Ministry to the sick and shut-ins.





Financial Update – Q3 2021

Who could have predicted that we would be 20 months into the Covid pandemic and still no bright lights on the horizon? The financial situation of our parish, and many parishes in the eparchy is challenging because our churches are far emptier than in years gone by. While we have worked hard to contain expenses, we can't forego the normal operations and maintenance of our church and rectory. Our average donations per week have dropped again for the second straight year. More dramatic; however, is the drop in the number of contributors over 2020. There has also been no Covid relief dollars received this year in the way of wage subsidies, etc.

We are providing this 9-month comparative update and ask that you continue to remember our parish in your prayers and in your financial generosity. Please support Saints Peter & Paul if you can.



Summary and Accountability:

Under the direction of the Bishop, or his designate, the Communication Coordinator works in ensuring that our Eparchy, Ministries and Organizations are made more visible to our Ukrainian Catholic community, both locally, nationally and internationally, through the development and maintenance of our Eparchial websites, Social Media, communication of materials and resources to our clergy, parish offices, communication reps and organizations, ensuring that information is shared and accessible, and to continue to develop better communication networks throughout our Eparchy.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:


