

Introduction

In May, 2023, Bishop Roborecki Branch UCBC will be celebrating its 90th anniversary – 90 years since it came into being on May 14, 1933. This historic event will take place in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in fifteen months.

This is the first of a series of fifteen informational articles that will appear monthly in preparation for Bishop Roborecki Branch's 90th anniversary. Each article will focus on a different theme. An effort will be made to provide both a historical perspective and a contemporary account of the branch's activities.

Additional sources as required will be acknowledged.



On behalf of the faithful, consecrated religious and clergy of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Canada we wish to express our deep appreciation to the Executive of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) for the prayerful support for our brothers and sisters in Ukraine during these tragic days. At the same time, we also wish to acknowledge the many expressions of solidarity from bishops, clergy, consecrated religious and faithful from across the country, who join with Ukrainian Catholics in Canada in expressing shock and dismay that in the 21st century such a war of aggression could occur in modern day Europe.

In watching the various news reports from Ukraine, it is interesting to note the many churches, bell towers and crosses that appear in the background.
