The Education Committee will be running a DVD scripture study on Sundays at 6:30 p.m. in the church auditorium. We will be "opening the book" at the Letter of James.





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am so grateful for all the support I have received thus far. The staff at the Bishop's Chancery office in Saskatoon has been incredible in the work in the lead up to my consecration and now they are hard back at work to serve the people of the Eparchy. So many people came to or watched online the celebrations during my consecration weekend – I heard there were even viewing parties.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the individuals, families, parishes, communities, and organizations for their generous gifts to me at my consecration. I am overwhelmed with gratitude. I only left Saskatchewan just over a year ago, but now I am beginning a new life here, a life for the long haul as your bishop, and it takes a lot to set up a new life now that I no longer live with my Redemptorist confreres in community.

Now, it is time to move forward. Let us move forward together in a spirit of listening, openness, and learning. Our Eparchy, from one corner of the Province to the other, is filled with people of good will, prayerful people, and talented people; let us come together as one in the Eparchy of Saskatoon to help build God's kingdom on earth - a kingdom of love, a kingdom of peace, and a kingdom of understanding.

Pope Francis' message for the 32nd World Day of the Sick (February 11, 2024)

Monday, January 29 2024

January 29, 2024, Ottawa – Earlier this year, the Vatican published <u>Pope Francis' message for the 32nd World Day of the Sick</u>, celebrated each year on February 11. The Holy Father's message for this year is entitled: "It is not good that man should be alone" – Caring for the sick by caring for relationships. Echoing the Holy Father's message, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) renews its commitment to prayer and accompaniment of the sick. Pope Francis reminds us of the fundamental importance of human relationships in the process of healing and comforting the sick.

The Holy Father refers to the biblical passage from the Book of Genesis, emphasizing that God created man by endowing him with vital relationships, and that loneliness, the result of sin, can lead to suffering and isolation. Pope Francis' message urges us to care for relationships with compassion and tenderness, while recalling the example of the Good Samaritan who approached his neighbor with deep compassion. The Holy Father also stresses that the sick, the fragile and the poor must be at the heart of the Church and at the center of our pastoral concerns.

The World Day of the Sick offers us another opportunity to pray for all those who suffer, and to reflect on our commitment to them. The CCCB invites all the faithful to adopt the compassionate gaze of Jesus towards those who suffer, are alone, marginalized or rejected. By working together to counter the culture of individualism and indifference, we can grow the culture of tenderness and compassion in our society. The CCCB encourages all members of the community to take concrete steps to accompany those who are ill and isolated, whether through prayer, visiting a loved one, offering gratitude to healthcare professionals and volunteers, or other acts of solidarity. Finally, the CCCB entrusts itself to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Health of the Sick, that she may intercede on behalf of all and help us to be artisans of outreach and fraternal relationships.

Meat fare Sunday



On the past two Sundays of this pre-Lenten period, the focus was placed on God's patience and limitless compassion, of His readiness to accept every sinner who returns to Him. This Sunday, we are powerfully reminded of a complementary truth: no one is as patient and merciful as God, but even He does not forgive those who do not repent. The God of love is also a God of righteousness, and when Christ comes again in glory. He will come as our Judge. Such is the message of Lent to each of

us: turn back while there is still time, repent before the End comes.

In today's Gospel Christ tells us in what manner we will be judged when He returns. Rather than pointing out that the righteous will consist of those who simply 'believe' in God and lead a good life, or even those who go to Church every Sunday, Christ tells us that it is not solely our faith, but also our actions that will determine our final destination. Jesus is more concerned about how we act toward those around us, and in particular, towards those less fortunate.

One of the important things that Christ teaches us through His message is that whatever we do to the next person, we do the same to Him. And it brings up the important fact that the true Christian is the one who sees Christ in everyone. All are created in the image and likeness of God; we are all (or at least strive to be) living icons of Christ. And it's when we recognize that image of Christ in everyone (including our 'enemies') that we take a step closer to residing in the mansions of the Father that have been prepared for us. Christian love is the "possible impossibility" to see Christ in another person, whoever he or she is, and whom God, in His eternal and mysterious plan, has decided to introduce into my life, be it only for a few moments, not as an occasion for a "good deed" or an exercise in philanthropy, but as the beginning of an eternal companionship in God Himself.

The parable of the Last Judgment is about Christian love. Not all of us are called to work for "humanity," yet each one of us has received the gift and the grace of Christ's love. We know that all persons ultimately need this personal love—the recognition in them of their unique soul. We also know that people are in prison and are sick and thirsty and hungry because that personal love has been denied them. And, finally, we know that however narrow and limited the framework of our personal existence, each one of us has been made responsible for a tiny part of the Kingdom of God, made responsible by that very gift of Christ's love. Thus, on whether or not we have accepted this responsibility, on whether we have loved or refused to love, shall we be judged.



The Great Fast is a preparation for the Second Coming of the Savior. But the judgment is not only in the future. Here and now, each day and each hour, in hardening our hearts toward others and in failing to respond to the opportunities we are given of helping them, we are already passing judgment on ourselves.

The next time that you set out to destroy someone's reputation, break someone's heart, show indifference and even ignorance toward a person, or maliciously gossip about someone, remember that Christ says that you're doing exactly the same thing to Him! Whatever you do wrong to the next person will count against you when the Righteous Judge returns. We Christians can sometimes be judgmental toward those around us, and yet we don't stop to think that this will reflect on Christ Himself. We take the duty of the Judge and make judgment against the Saviour. We really need to see that icon of Christ in everyone no matter who they are. We also need to ACT as Christians, and what this means is pouring out our hearts and resources to those less fortunate around us. Great and Holy Lent is a time for repentance, change, and renewal in our lives. It's also a time to evaluate what we have done in terms of caring for our neighbor.
